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How much do we spend?



- My best guess (definitely doesn't include everything!)
- Children's services (not inc schools):
 - Over £600 million per year
- Services for adults (mainly social services spend):
 - Over £6.4 billion per year
 - £45,000 per year for EVERY ADULT with learning disabilities known to social services
- Overall £7 billion per year
- Or 8 full teams of Cristiano Ronaldos





- Children's services (not including schools):
 - Over £600 million per year
 - Residential special schools
 - Looked after children (foster care and residential support)
 - Social services support (children in need with families and looked after children)






















- Services for adults
 - NHS funded specialist inpatient units
 - 3,000ish people at any one time
 - £560 million per year







- Services for adults
 - Nursing care
 - Around 2,000 people
 - £131 million per year





- Services for adults
 - Supported/other accommodation
 - Around 52,000 people
 - £976 million per year





















But...




 The most common living situation for adults with learning disabilities is living with their family (over 50,000 adults known to social services)





- Services for adults
 - Day services
 - Around 50,000 people
 - £730 million per year














- Services for adults
 - Home care
 - Around 42,000 people
 - £750 million per year





















- Services for adults
 - Direct payments
 - Around 30,000 people
 - £428 million per year






- Services for adults
 - Other' community-based services
 - Around 22,000 people
 - £158 million per year





- Services for adults
 - Assessment and care management
 - £327 million per year

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
- Right balance going to children vs adults?

Who commissions (buys) these services?

- 10 NHS England specialised commissioning teams
- 221 Clinical Commissioning Groups
- 152 local authorities



Ninjas!



- Take some of this money off local commissioners (NHS money on inpatient units?)
- National ninja taskforce led by people with learning disabilities and families in charge of the money
- Money moves with people out of inpatient units – funds good, personalised, local support
- Only give the money back to local commissioners when they can be trusted with it?


- Who are the right people to 'commission' (buy) services and supports for people with learning disabilities?

A chip off the old block (contract)


- A lot of money tied up in big block contracts with big service providers
- Why is the security with the provider rather than with the person with learning disabilities?





Guarantee personal budgets?

- Guaranteed personal budget amount for person for 10 years (amount can go up but not down in that time):
 - Can REALLY plan
 - Can get what you want (on your own or with other people)
- Does this need to be supported by INDEPENDENT, strong self advocacy and advocacy and/or something like circles of support?








Adults aged 18+ in residential / nursing care or adult placement






Adults aged 18-64 – other living situations






Adults aged 18+ Community-based services






Adults aged 18-64 – Direct payments & self-directed support






Adults aged 18-64 – Social services spending
