Audience:	The workshop is aimed at senior managers at organisations involved in providing for people with Learning Disabilities and Autism Spectrum Disorders with a particular emphasis on the reprovision for people from long-standing registered care homes or hospital placements.

The workshop will address the barriers and other issues faced by housing and care providers, including:

- **Models:** establishing economically viable arrangements whilst also allowing true choice for individuals within those settings, overcoming 'cultural' issues from families and commissioners.
- **Commissioners:** the arguments to put to local authorities / CCGs to persuade them to tender housing and support together.
- **Rights of individuals:** Ordinary Residence and the right to access the accommodation and care of choice, the range of personalised budgets available; how to deal with mental capacity issues and the re-assessment process.
- **Regulation:** de-registration issues, the impact of regulation on the culture of supported living facilities and whether they are registerable as Care Homes by CQC.
- **Funding:** what are the capital funding options available to help you build / convert accommodation, can the rates for 'basic' home care under frameworks deliver the necessary levels of support? How do you deal with voids, shared costs etc.
- **Families:** how you can work with families who want to make provision for their relatives through trust arrangements.

- Anthony Collins Welfare Reform: the implications for supported living arising from recent olicitors and forthcoming changes in exempt rents and local housing allowance.
- Staff: the 'problem' of night cover and paying NMW, the appropriate methods to ensure staff are available to work flexibly as services are reconfigured.
